DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Judy Garland. One of the most beloved performers of all time. Her talent continues to live on long after her through countless songs and movies. Everyone knows Judy Garland, the star. But Judy was more than a star. She was a person. Billy Van Zandt's *The Property Known as Garland* allows the real Judy to take the stage. In it, she reflects on her life, the ups and downs that have led to what would be her final performance before her death in 1969, grappling with one question in particular- is she loved?

When asked to direct this show, I was thrilled and terrified. I worried I would not do Judy justice. I was wrong. If I was thinking about Judy as this star, I was missing the purpose of Van Zandt's work: recognizing that Judy was human. I relate to Judy in many ways. A strained relationship with a parent, struggling with self-worth, doubting whether I am loved. Through this show, I felt like I had found a friend I did not know was there. Someone who understood my struggle. It reminded me that we are all people with issues and lives and secrets who suffer occasional breakdowns and need to know someone will be there at the end of the day to say, "I love you." It is a reminder of what it means to be human.

Thank you to my small, but mighty, cast— Stacy and Ryan! It has been an absolute joy to work with you both. A huge shoutout to Jonathan and Jasmine for encouraging me to take on this project. Thank you for your support throughout this very short and very exciting production process. Thank you to the Hershey Area Playhouse for offering me this opportunity as well as the creative visionaries who helped to make this production a reality. I would also like to thank my family and friends for their constant support and love. Thank you especially to my mom who inspires me every day to be who I am.

Finally, I would like to thank the woman for which we are all here tonight: Judy Garland. Not the star, but the person. I hope that you can walk away from this production feeling like you have gained a friend in Judy, someone who understands your struggles. Not because she went through the same thing, but because she is human as well. That is the message I think Judy would want to be remembered for. And I'm sure that somewhere over the rainbow she is encouraging us to share it.
